Exhibit 1: The Atlantic Slave Trade

- 1. Explain the Triangular Trade. What role did the British colonies play in the Triangular Trade?
- 2. How would you describe the experience of the Middle Passage?
- 3. What percentage of enslaved Africans went to South America? To Central America and the Caribbean? To North America?

Exhibit 2: Plantation Agriculture

- 1. What is the difference between plantation agriculture and subsistence farming?
- 2. What is a cash crop?
- 3. What were the four most profitable cash crops grown in the British colonies? In what colony/colonies was each one grown?
- 4. What other territories did Britain control in the Americas *other than* the North American colonies? Why is this significant?

Exhibit 3: Slavery across the Colonies

- 1. What role did the Royal African Company play in the Atlantic slave trade?
- 2. Why did the colonies establish "slave codes?" What did they do?
- 3. Describe the difference between slavery in the New England/Middle colonies and slavery in the Chesapeake/Southern colonies.

Exhibit 4: Slave Culture and Resistance

- 1. Explain the origins of Gullah and how it demonstrates the formation of a unique slave culture.
- 2. What was the Stono Rebellion? Why is it important?

- 1. Explain the relationship between the Triangular Trade and slavery in the colonies.
- 2. Why did slavery develop in the colonies? Which colonies had the most slaves? Why?

- 4. How did slaves resist slavery? How did they maintain their culture/religion/identity?
